

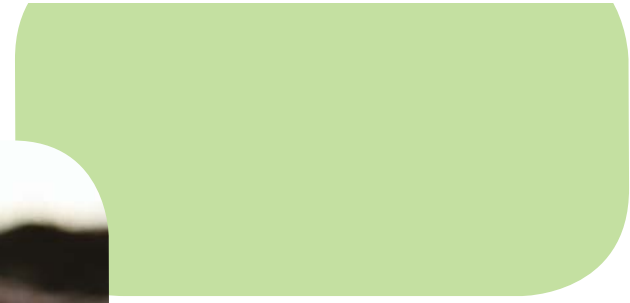

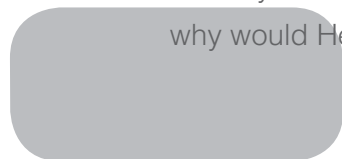
Imagine twenty years from now
